# What have we been learning this week

## NURSERY

This week in Literacy, we'll continue exploring The Little Red Riding Hood as students identify the same phonemes and practise paying attention to more than one thing through fun, action-based activities. In Maths, the focus will be on counting, where children will listen to number names, practise saying them in order, and join in counting together through engaging songs and activities. Meanwhile, in IEYC, our students are getting ready for the exciting Exit Point celebration next week, where they will proudly share all their wonderful learning and achievements. ❤️🍵🐱

## RECEPTION

This week in Reception, the children wrapped up Term 1.1 with exciting learning adventures!

🎨 In Literacy, they continued exploring Goldilocks and the Three Bears 🐼🐼🐼 and created their very own storybooks by drawing pictures and labelling them with phonics sounds. In Math they began a new block on Circles and Triangles, identifying and naming shapes, comparing their features, spotting them in the environment and describing their positions using words like on, under, and next to before completing their End-of-Block Checkpoint ✅. For IEYC, the children eagerly prepared for their Exit Point celebration, reflecting on their learning and getting ready to share their wonderful work with pride! 🌍



## Year 1

This week, we wrapped up Term 1.2 with exciting learning and celebrations. In IPC, we completed our unit 'Who am I' and revisited key concepts through reflection activities. In Maths, students practised subtraction using number lines, cross-out methods, and learnt fact families. In English, they wrote captions and labels and completed their assessment on instruction writing.

On Tuesday, we enjoyed our Exit Point, celebrating our learning journey, and on Thursday, we joined the Deepavali Assembly, dressed in beautiful traditional attire.

## Year 2

### Math

This week, the children practised different subtraction strategies. They learned how to subtract across 10, subtract from 10, and subtract a one-digit number from a two-digit number. The lessons also included consolidation activities to review both addition and subtraction skills.

### English

In English, the children focused on story writing. They identified settings, created characters, and planned simple storylines. They also completed reading comprehension exercises to strengthen their understanding of texts.

### IPC – The Earth Our Home

For IPC, the children explored how places have changed over time. During their Exit Point, they reflected on what they had learned throughout the unit and shared their ideas. They also have a wonderful time visiting Aquaria KLCC.



## Year 3

This week in Year 3, we celebrated the end of our IPC topic with our exciting Exit Point, where we shared our learning about Material World with our grown-ups. In English, we became advertisers, creating persuasive adverts for McLay's Jam using catchy slogans and descriptive language.

In Reading, we finished our class book An Alien in the Jam Factory and wrote thoughtful book reviews to share our opinions and favourite moments.

We also enjoyed taking part in the Deepavali Assembly, learning more about this beautiful celebration, and had an exciting trip to the Recycling Centre, where we discovered how materials are reused and recycled.

It's been a fun-filled and memorable week in Year 3!



## Year 4

This term in IPC, our Year 4 students have been exploring the Nature of Life. They showcased their learning during the Exit Point presentations, confidently sharing their understanding with parents. It was wonderful to see such great teamwork and enthusiasm!

In Maths, we reviewed addition and subtraction and completed an assessment to consolidate learning. In English, students reflected on their final writing pieces and revisited important grammar topics, including expanded noun phrases, irregular verbs, and possessive plurals.

And of course, an incredible dance performance! The students practiced and performed beautifully for the Deepavali assembly, well done to everyone involved! We're proud of the progress the students have made and look forward to more exciting learning next half term!

## Year 5

This is the final week for T1.1 and lots of things are happening. Kicking off with our IPC Exit Point on Friday for Roots, shoots and fruits, where we have been preparing vigorously everyday. Next up is our English grammar revision and writing checklist for our short story. In math, we have covered prime numbers, square numbers, cube numbers and Multiply up to 100000. For reading, we have completed James and the giant peach book with Vipers' questions. Finally, we ended with our Deepavali celebration assembly, full of beats, colors and performances!

## Bahasa Melayu

This week in Bahasa, our Primary students are exploring Malaysian culture by learning a traditional village song or dance. ## Music

EY students focused on expressing music through movement, moving like animals to music. KS1 students continued working on music writing and coloring musical notes, exploring crotchets and quavers. KS2 students focused on xylophone playing and developing basic sight-reading skills, while Year 6 practiced ukulele strumming patterns for "I'm Yours."



## PE

This week in EY, students concluded their Fundamental Movement Skills unit with a variety of movement games such as Rabbit Turtle Rodeo, Would You Rather, Kung Fu Panda Run and Manta Ray breathing exercises. In KS1, students completed their IPC Fundamental Sports Skills unit by doing self-assessment worksheets to reflect on their skill development. They also enjoyed fun games like The Dinosaur Dance, Safari Run, Bear Breaths and Lion on the Loose.

This week in KS2 PE, students successfully completed their PE units and were rewarded for their effort and hard work with a fun selection of sports and engaging indoor games.

# Respecting our Differences

The festive season invites us to slow down, reflect, and reconnect with the values that truly matter: kindness, generosity and respect. Here are some ways we can help our children put these values into practice.

## ▶ Respecting Our Differences

- Respect means recognising that not everyone celebrates or believes the same way – and that’s what makes our community interesting.
- Encourage curiosity instead of comparison.
- Listening and asking questions shows care and openness.
- Respect also means not teasing or excluding someone for celebrating differently – or not celebrating at all.

## ▶ Modelling Respect and Gratitude at Home

- Children learn from what they see – parents can model respect through simple, consistent actions.
- Saying “please,” “thank you,” and showing appreciation teaches children empathy.
- Acknowledge people who make the season special – cleaners, canteen staff, guards, teachers and friends.
- Practise small family traditions of gratitude to build respect and connection.

## ▶ Celebrating Togetherness and Inclusion

- Encourage students to share the festive spirit with everyone – through greetings, sharing snacks or helping decorate.
- Remind them that true celebration is about including others, not excluding anyone.
- Respecting differences makes every community stronger and every celebration more meaningful.
- Being thoughtful about noise, waste, and the environment shows respect for others, too.

## ▶ Respect in Everyday Actions

- Listen before responding – everyone deserves to be heard.
- Avoid unkind jokes or teasing – especially about how someone dresses, eats, or celebrates.
- Use polite language, even when disagreeing.
- Be considerate of others’ beliefs, time, and personal space.

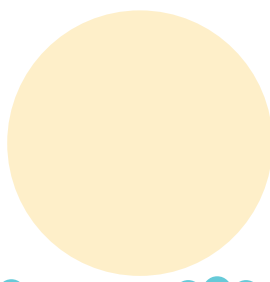
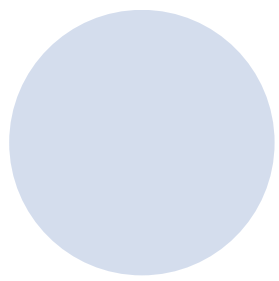
