Another group demonstrating great courage are our Year 11 IGCSE students, who have now begun their examinations in earnest this week. Their classrooms are filled with focused and targeted revision, collaborative questioning, and a clear sense of purpose and drive. We are incredibly proud of the way they are balancing their studies, usual responsibilities, and the pressures of the exam season—while still maintaining their energy and positivity.

I want to take this opportunity again to stress that we expect all Year 11 students to attend school as usual throughout the examination period. Our teachers are delivering structured revision lessons as part of the regular timetable, alongside booster classes tailored to support each student. Continued attendance is essential so students can access this support from our expert teachers, consolidate key skills with their peers, and approach each exam with confidence on their own.

In addition to the Year 11 exams, I'd also like to briefly highlight the upcoming GL Progress Tests in English and Mathematics for Years 7 to 10. These will take place during the week of the 16th of June and will be timetabled and supported in our ICT lab. Further details will be shared closer to the date.

Finally, for the majority of last term, our students were focused on identifying and defining our Straits Attributes. PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES

ENGLISH

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	English 1 - Students continued their exploration of Romeo and Juliet. They have begun their first formative assessment of the term with a letter using various writing techniques.
	English 2 - Students wrote a profile of yourself to prepare for an interview.
Y8	English 1 - Students made their way further into AMSND, focusing on characterisation of the Mechanicals. They have also begun their first formative of the term with a PEA paragraph focusing on how Shakespeare has portrayed the Mechanicals in the play.
	English 2 - Students wrote a biography about a historical figure.
Y9	English 1 - Students analysed the characterisation and rhetorical devices used in Chapter 1 of 'Animal Farm', then went on to read Chapter 2 and answer some comprehension questions.
	English 2 - Students wrote an argumentative essay of for and against about building a new park in Rawang.

PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES

ENGLISH

Y10	<p>First Language English - Students completed a piece of directed writing and answered some vocabulary questions about families in different countries/eras. They then spent time carefully selecting information through research, which they used to support them in answering some questions about the writer's craft in a related text.</p>
	<p>English as a Second Language - Students used note-taking skills to identify key points about Soma Akriton in Cyprus.</p>
	<p>English Literature - Students answered questions about Act 3 Scene 1 of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream', ensuring a deep understanding of the events and Shakespeare's intentions. They then watched a version of Act 3 Scene 2, answering some comprehension questions before debating whether the events of the scene are ethical through shared presentations.</p>
Y11	<p>First Language English/Literature - Students recapped notes and slides from their previous Literature study, focusing on studied poetry, 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' and 'Things Fall Apart' in turn.</p>
	<p>English as a Second Language - Students wrote an email about a carnival day in a tourist spot to a friend.</p>

MATHEMATICS

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students learned on linear function and started to learn about linear graphs; vertical and horizontal graphs.
Y8	Students learned on linear function and started to learn about linear graphs; vertical and horizontal graphs.
Y9	Students learned to calculate simple interest and earnings from daily financial tasks.
Y10	Students learned on simplifying ratio, solving word problem involving ratio and learned on application of maps and scale.
Y11	Students attempted on targeted past paper 1 & 2 examination questions and revisited all the formulas.
Y10 Add Math	Students learned to convert radian measures from degrees.
Y11 Add Math	Students practiced some Paper 1 targeted questions.

Y7	Students learned about the solar system, the phases of the moon, and the differences between the geocentric and heliocentric models.
Y8	Students have explored food webs, the impact of pesticides on ecosystems, the process of bioaccumulation, and the effects of invasive species on native environments.
Y9	Students practiced exam based question and techniques of answering questions on electrolysis of molten and aqueous ionic compound.
Y10	Combined Science - Students learned and practiced answering Paper 6 planning question on electrolysis.
	Physics - Students learned about concave and convex lenses, drawing of lens diagram for both the lenses and uses of both the lenses in correcting shortsightedness and longsightedness.
	Biology - Students researched on the different cardiovascular diseases, their causes and treatments.
	Chemistry - Students learnt how to calculate the bond energies
