Our term is in full swing, and along with our academic achievements, we have also taken part in a number of successful events! I am extremely proud of all our students and staff who continue to grow our wonderful learning community.

We held our first round of GL assessments of the year with our Year 7 and Year 10 learners sitting their CAT4 baseline assessments. The CAT4 assessment is designed to help understand how learners learn and what their academic potential might be. It assesses four key reasoning areas so that our teachers can accurately understand what each learner needs in the classroom. These assessments are invaluable to us as teachers because we can see the strengths and areas for improvement learners need to be as successful as possible. We can use the data from these assessments in our daily planning and in our planning for each student to succeed at IGCSE in Year 11. If you have questions about the GL assessments used here in school, please reach out.

In keeping with the theme of a busy school term, we also hosted the ISP careers/university fair that all of our secondary students are invited to attend. A University Fair is where different universities set up booths to share information about their programs, admission requirements, campus life, and more. It's a great way to get a feel for what each university offers and ask any questions you might have. Our students from Year 11 down to Year 7 had the opportunity to explore their potential futures and start making real plans as to where they will end up, and the impact that they will make on the world!

Post-IGCSE is an exciting but sometimes daunting prospect as students have an enormously important decision to make with regards to their future studies and careers. We wish to support our students and their families with this decision through our Future Pathways Programme (FTP) here in the Secondary School. Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	In EFL, students have examined the life and times of Charles Dickens.
	In ESL, students did a listening practice about reduce, reuse, recycle by filling in the gap.
Y8	In EFL, students have further examined The Blue Carbuncle.
	In ESL, students wrote a formal letter to the town council to improve the local area.






CAFÉ CONVERSATIONS: BUILDING CONFIDENCE THROUGH ROLE-PLAY"




