Dear Secondary Community,

This has been another successful week of learning across the school. Our students are now preparing for their major examinations, with the Areas of Study released this week to support focused revision and planning. We also hosted the KLSL Swimming Meet here at Straits, where our swimmers represented the school with determination, skill, and excellent sportsmanship.

We held our first major Future Pathways event of the year this week with our Annual Future Pathways Festival, which gave students across the secondary school the opportunity to explore a range of academic and career directions beyond IGCSE. Our Future Pathways programme is designed to guide every student towards a post-Year II route that aligns with their strengths, goals, and interests. Students in Years 7–9 meet with our team at least once a year to discuss their developing aspirations, while students in KS4 receive more personalised support from both the Senior Leadership Team and the Future Pathways Advisors to ensure that their subject choices and academic journey lead them confidently toward their next stage of study, including university.

Part of this support involves providing students with opportunities to lead and act as changemakers within our school community. Our Student Directors have embraced this responsibility as Visionaries and Connectors by organising our first International Day and Lapathon on the 6th of December. This event will celebrate the rich cultural diversity of our school, with students, families, and staff hosting cultural booths that showcase the food, traditions, and heritage of different nations. In doing so, our students are developing as Global Citizens, learning to appreciate and value the perspectives and histories of others. Alongside the cultural celebration, we will be holding a Lapathon to raise funds in support of refugee associations. Students and the wider community will be encouraged to complete as many laps as possible around the school grounds—walking, jogging, or running—while wearing their national colours or traditional dress. This element of the event highlights empathy, service, and shared responsibility, demonstrating what it means to contribute positively to the world beyond our school.

More detailed information will be sent out in the coming days by our Student Directors, including an invitation for families who may wish to volunteer or host a cultural booth. Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	English 1 -Students completed reading chapters 18-25 of the Holes Novel. They completed a presentation, individual diary entry and summarised the chapters.
	English 2 - Students wrote an escape plan for Stanley with creativity and imagination according to Holes.
Y8	English 1 -Students did a revision on a scandal in Bohemia , did a presentation and an opinion writing on the main character.
	English 2 - Students planned for a PEA paragraph to explain Holmes's dual nature in assisting his investigations.
Y9	English 1 - This week, students read Chapter 10 of Animal Farm and focused on how things have changed from the start to the finish of the novella.
	English 2 - Students revised on Animal Farm to summarise each chapter with main events.



PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES ENGLISH

Y10	First Language English - This week, students read Auden's poem 'The Capital', and explored the use of apostrophe. They then used the poem as inspiration for writing a narrative.
	English as a Second Language - Students wrote a review about a new shopping centre following the exam-style question.
	First Language English - This week, students researched a historical 'great' and summarised their life into a short biography. The week ended with some narrative writing practice.
Y11	English Literature - This week, students read Auden's poem 'The Capital', and explored the use of apostrophe.
	English as a Second Language - Students practised vocablary skills on Technology and used words effectively in constructing complex sentences.



PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES MATHEMATICS

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students used the concept of rounding for whole numbers and decimals.
Y8	Students learned to round numbers to a given decimal places and significant figure.
Υ9	Students learned to proved the regular polygon with the angle facts and decribe the properties of circle.
Y10	Students learned to factorise quadratic espressions with one or more coefficient of x.
Yll	Additional Maths - Students learn to find the turning point by sketching the quadratic graph and by completing the square.
Y10 Add Math	Students completed their formative assessment and learne on finding the bearing.
Yll Add Math	Additional Maths - Students completed the formative assessment and learned on arithmetic progression.



SCIENCE

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students used the concept of resultant force to explain whether a change in speed occurs and used Newton meters to measure forces accurately.
Y8	Students described what cellular respiration is and explained why it occurs in all living organisms at all times, and constructed a lung model to demonstrate the process.
Y9	Students learned about different types energy resources, how they are used to produce electricity and their advantages and disadvantages.
	Combined Science - Students explored the factors affecting chemical reactions and how these factors can be used to increase the rate of reaction.
Y10	Physics - Students learned to calculate momentum and use the principle of conservation of momentum to calculate momentum, mass and velocity before and after collision.
	Biology - Students defined and described diffusion.
	Chemistry - Students summarised ionic bonding & learnt how to construct its formula.



SCIENCE

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
	Combined Science - Students learned about gas exchange and human respiratory system.
Y11	Physics - Students continued practicing past year questions focusing on paper 4 to enhance their answering skills.
	Biology - Students consolidated the eye structure to its function and explored the accomodation & pupil reflexes mechanism.
	Chemistry - Students researched then presented the trend accross Period 3 of The Periodic Table.

HUMANITIES

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y 7	Enterprise - Students completed Formative Assessment 3 this week until the topic of Stakeholders to assess their understanding and application of key concepts.
	Geography - Students continued categorising different types of energy and described how energy use differs across the world.
Y8	History - Students explored the teachings of Confucius and his disciples, learning how his ideas shaped Chinese society, leadership, and moral values. Through discussion and creative tasks, they reflected on how Confucian principles such as respect, honesty, and self-discipline remain relevant today.
	Enterprise - Students completed Formative Assessment 3 this week until the topic of SWOT Ananlysis to assess their understanding and application of key concepts.
Υ9	Geography - Students continued explaining how different countries contribute to the production of a single product, highlighting the global connections involved in its creation.
	History - Students stepped back into Tudor England to compare education and leisure during the 1500s. They discovered how life differed for rich and poor Tudors and enjoyed interactive activities that brought Tudor games, entertainment, and school routines to life.
	Enterprise - Students completed Formative Assessment 3 this week until the topic of Business Plan to assess their understanding and application of key concepts.
	Geography - Students described where people live in the DRC and explained what the country's population structure looks like.
	History - Students examined the powerful reasons that encouraged men to enlist in World War I, from patriotism and duty to propaganda and peer pressure. They analysed real recruitment posters and testimonies, developing empathy and critical understanding of wartime motivations.

HUMANITIES



Y10	Business Studies - Students completed Formative Assessment 3 this week on Chapter 1 - 8 to assess their understanding and application of key concepts. They also learned about globalisation, exploring its key features, causes, and effects on economies and businesses.
	Accounting - Students completed Formative Assessment 3 this week on Chapter 3-4 to assess their understanding and application of key concepts. They also learned about the cash book and petty cash book this week.
	Travel and Tourism - Students examined the social, economic, environmental, and technological factors that influence global tourism. They used real-world examples and group discussions to understand how changing trends shape destinations and traveller behaviour.
	History - Students investigated the League's work through its Health, Refugee, Labour, Economic, and Slavery Organisations. Through collaborative learning, they evaluated how far the League succeeded in improving lives in the 1920s and 1930s
	Global Perspectives - Students learnt how to answer Question 3 from the past year Paper 1 (written paper). They also completed Formative Assessment 3 this week on Question 3 to assess their understanding and application of key concepts.
Y11	Business Studies - Students completed Formative Assessment 3 this week on Chapter 25-28 to assess their understanding and application of key concepts. They also learned about ratio analysis, exploring how financial ratios are used to assess a business's performance and financial position.
	Economics - Students completed Formative Assessment 3 this week on Chapter 35-38 to assess their understanding and application of key concepts. They also learned about trading blocs, exploring their features, benefits, and impact on international trade.
	Travel and Tourism - This week, students completed a formative assessment on Unit 5, and began revising topics 5.1 and 5.2 in preparation for their major assessments.
	History - Students explored the dramatic events of 1918, analysing why Germany collapsed and how the Kaiser's abdication led to the birth of the Weimar Republic.
	Global Perspectives -students have been finalising their Individual Projects, demonstrating independent research and critical thinking. They explored global issues from multiple perspectives and presented thoughtful, well supported conclusions.



ICT

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	This week in ICT, students began exploring the wonderful world of binary code. They learnt how to decode and translate binary and how computers use this to understand complex systems.
Y8	Students learned how to set data types and primary key for a database
Y 9	Students explored IF Functions in excel and how it works based on conditions.
Y10	ICT: This week in ICT, students learned image and layout formatting. Computer Science: This week, CS students learned calculation of sound file sizes.
YII	Students practiced a past year question paper on spreadsheet and discussed the email communication.

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students continued developing their duet compositions and prepared for both Formative Assessment (FA) and End-of-Term (EOT) assessments.
Y8	Students had a practical blues music session, focusing on smooth transitions between sections.
Y9	Students continued practical performance work, concentrating on polishing the chorus and outro sections of their pieces.

YII	Students worked on their IGCSE composition coursework and focused on their trio performance piece in preparation for assessment.



Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Our Year 7 artists have been exploring colour, shape and form in a wonderfully playful way. Taking inspiration from Jon Burgerman, they experimented with continuous line portraits that capture personality and movement. Students loved combining imaginative and expressive elements, producing bold, bright, and joy-filled outcomes that reflect their growing confidence and creativity.
Y8	This week, Year 8 launched their exciting new project, Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them. They began by creating detailed observational sketches of real animals, paying attention to texture, proportion and pattern. Next, they'll combine these features to invent their own original mythical creatures, blending imagination with strong drawing skills. The classroom has been buzzing with inventive ideas and laughter!
Υ9	Year 9 students have been learning how art can communicate powerful social messages. Through the work of Shepard Fairey and Keith Haring, they've been inspired to create bold, simplified designs using clean lines and strong shapes—perfect for printmaking. It's been inspiring to see how they interpret their own ideas about culture, identity, and community through art.



ART

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y10	Our Year 10 IGCSE artists are developing refined studies of natural forms, from shells to leaves and flowers. They're focusing on composition, tone, and texture, and beginning to connect these studies with artist research and personal interpretations. Their portfolios should becoming rich with experimentation and layered techniques.
YII	Year 11 are perfecting their Component 1 coursework portfolios. Students are carefully reviewing their journeys—making sure research, experimentation, and outcomes clearly link together. With focus and determination, they're preparing to present cohesive, confident portfolios that showcase both technical skill and personal vision.

Y10	Foreign Language - Students read the passage about self introduction and family members.

	First Language - This week, Year 10 First Language Chinese students read the text 《被放逐的皇后》 and completed the related comprehension questions. They also practiced writing sentences describing a night market to enhance their descriptive writing skills and completed their fourth formative assessment.
Y11	Foreign Language - This week, students reviewed vocabulary about neighbourhood surroundings, practiced describing local facilities, and enhanced writing skills by composing short paragraphs about their community environment and nearby places.
