Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	English 1 -Students completed chapters 12 -15 of the Holes Novel and did a journal writing.
	English 2 - Students related the present and past stories to find out similarities and differences in Camp Green Lake.
Y8	English 1 -Students completed chapters 1-3 of the scandal in Bohemia and completed a writing task on it
	English 2 - Students wrote an opening paragraph from the point of view of Sherlock Holmes in making deductions.
<b>Y</b> 9	English 1 - Students explored connections between Animal Farm and historical context in Chapter 7 by comparing Napoleon's fear tactics with Stalin's purges.
	English 2 - Students analysed the key events of Animal Farm using a timeline chart, focusing on the pig's power.



#### PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES ENGLISH

Y10	First Language English - Students spent time making improvements to their formative assessments and further exploring the effects of figurative language in a text. They also studied a new poem: 'Rich and Poor or, Saint and Sinner' and wrote a mini-essay.
	English as a Second Language - Students analysed the famous quotations of successful people and applied them in their education.

	English as a Second Language - Students wrote a report entitled 'A visit to a biotechnology laboratory'.



#### PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES MATHEMATICS

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students learned to construct expressions and solving simple equations
Y8	Students learned to factorising expression by removing common factors with brackets.
Y9	Students learned on substitution of a letter by a number and learned on collecting like terms to simplify an expression.
Y10	Students learned on finding gradient, y-intercept and equation of a straight line.
YII	Additional Maths - Students learned on solving modulus function both graphically and algebraically.
Y10 Add Math	Students learned to solve quadratic equations using completing the square.
Y11 Add Math	Additional Maths - Students learned to use Pascal's triangle for expansion and to find the coefficient of a term.



#### **SCIENCE**

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	This week, students identified and named common laboratory equipment used when working with mixtures, used key terms to describe a solution, and explained how making a solution affects its total mass.
Y8	This week, students described and calculated pressure, explored how a force acting over an area affects pressure, and investigated how pressure changes in liquids.
Y9	Students learned of diferent types of energy and energy stores.
	Combined Science - Students learned on the factors affecting photosynthesis which includes light and carbon dioxide.
Y10	Physics - Students explored on Hooke's Law and force acting on an object that is moving in a circular motion.
	Biology - Students investigated the structures and functions of plant and animal cells.
	Chemistry - Students learnt on isotopes and its function.



#### **SCIENCE**

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
	Combined Science - Students practiced answering exam based question focusing on paper 4 C7, C8, C9 and C10.
Y11	Physics - Students practiced answering exam based questions focusing on paper 4 electricity and magnetism.
	Biology - Students explored ho urine is formed in the nephron and problems to the kidney.
	Chemistry - Students investigated ways to prepare insoluble salts.





#### **HUMANITIES**

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Enterprise - Students completed Formative Assessment 2 on stakeholders to assess their understanding of the topic.  Geography - Students described how different map projections represent the world and explored how each projection can change the way continents and countries appear in shape and size.
Y8	History - Students explored the Lydia, Persia, and Babylon empires and created detailed mind maps to show their understanding.
	Enterprise - Students completed Formative Assessment 2 on different types of risks to assess their understanding of the topic.
	Geography - Students described the characteristics and landforms found in the upper course of a river and explained how erosion shapes features such as waterfalls, gorges, and interlocking spurs.
	History - Students learned about Queen Elizabeth I's portraits and discussed the messages they conveyed to the people of her time.
Y9	Enterprise - Students completed Formative Assessment 2 on Action Plan to assess their understanding of the topic.
	Geography - Students explained what pyroclastic flows, ash, and lahars are, and related these volcanic hazards to real-life examples from recent and historical eruptions.
	History - Students concluded their study on the Suffragists and Suffragettes, summarising the key differences and impact of both movements.

#### PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES HUMANITIES



Y10	Business Studies - Students deepened their understanding of Public Corporations by working through past examination questions.
	Accounting - Students learned about business documents and answered questions to deepen their understanding.
	Travel and Tourism - Students learned about the different types of tourists and explored their characteristics and motivations.
	History - Students studied the League of Nations and participated in a role-play activity to understand the roles of different member countries.
	Global Perspectives - The students were guided on strategies to effectively answer Question 2 of Paper 1 and subsequently applied their learning through past year practice questions.
Y11	Business Studies - Students deepened their understanding of break-even analysis by practising past year questions.
	Economics - Students delivered a presentation on Globalisation to enhance their presentation skills and demonstrate their understanding of the topic.
	Travel and Tourism - Students learned about the different types of market research and how the information gained can be analysed by tourism businesses. Students completed a formative assessment of case study exam-style questions.
	History - Students continued working on their Storybird project based on the Home Front and Western Front during the war.
	Global Perspectives -Students continued developing their Component 2 individual projects with teacher guidance and feedback.

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	This week in ICT, the students finished off their formative explaining what they know about effective search strategies and reliable sources.
Y8	Students learned how to print spreadsheet showing the formulae.
Y9	Students learned how parity check works in transmission of data.
Y10	ICT: This week in ICT, students learned hardware and software in computer system and continued on database report Computer Science: This week, CS students learned negative numbers in binary system and storage units
YII	Students practiced a past year question paper on building stylesheet using Microsoft web expression and completed needs of audience.



#### PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES MUSIC

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students composed duet percussion pieces using crotchet rests, crotchets, and quavers.
Y8	Students worked on Blues music, focusing mainly on musical forms such as the introduction, attack, and outro.
Y9	Students focused on practical study, developing their individual parts within an ensemble.
Y10	N/A
YII	Students began working on their second composition coursework.



Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Year 7 have been carefully finalising their Morandi Still Life paintings, focusing on subtle tones, composition, and control of brushwork. This week they have begun an exciting new project inspired by Georgia O'Keeffe, exploring shells as natural forms. Students have been observing real shells to create detailed drawings, learning how to capture line, shape, and form in preparation for larger-scale work.
Y8	Year 8 have been completing their Banksy-Inspired Street Art projects, combining stencilling techniques with personal messages about community and individuality. A highlight of the week was when some students collaborated on a large outdoor mural, experimenting with spray paint to bring their designs to life—an experience that was both creative and memorable!
Y9	Year 9 have launched into their Pop Art unit, studying the bold, colourful styles of artists like Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein. They have started by drawing simplified portraits using clear outlines and strong blocks of colour, developing both accuracy and confidence in their mark-making.
Y10	Year 10 have begun a collective project on Natural Forms, designed to strengthen their observational drawing skills. Through close study of plants, shells, and other organic shapes, students are learning how to translate detailed observation into dynamic compositions that explore texture, form, and tonal contrast.
YII	Year 11 are fully immersed in their IGCSE Component 1 coursework. They are building their personal projects with increasing independence, focusing on experimentation, refinement, and presentation. The students are showing great dedication as they explore their chosen themes in depth and prepare for their final submissions later this term.

Y7	Intermediate - This week, Year 7 Intermediate Mandarin students completed their revision sheets and prepared for next week's formative assessment.
	Advanced - This week, the students discussed issues related to appearance anxiety and the impact of cosmetic surgery, and they also read the article 《整容后过关的那些囧事》。
Y8	Intermediate - This week, students learned vocabulary about leisure activities, discussed their favorite pastimes, practiced related sentence structures, and wrote short paragraphs describing how they spent their weekends and holidays.






