Y7	English 1 - Students read and summarised chapter 3-6 of the Holes novel and completed a Formative assessment.
	English 2 - Students wrote point, evidence, analysis (PEA) paragraph for a character in 'Holes' and completed formative assessment 1.
Y8	English 1 -Students wrote a Gothic horror story using the techniques they had been taught—such as setting, atmosphere, characters, and theme—and completed a formative assessment.
	English 2 - Students researched on comprehension questions for 'A Scandal in Bohemia' and completed formative assessment 1.
Y9	English 1 - Students read Chapter 3 of Animal Farm and explored how Animalism is developing, working on expressing their own opinions and analysing the use of propaganda.
	English 2 - Students read Chapter 3 of 'Animal Farm' and wrote point, evidence, analysis (PEA) paragraph for a character, also completed formative assessment 1.

Y8	Students learned about squares, cubes and their roots.
Y9	Students learned about indices laws including negative and fractional indices.
Y10	Students learned to simplify, expanding and rationalising surds.
YII	Additional Maths - NA
Y10 Add Math	Students learned to solve simultaneous equations involving linear equations.
Yll Add Math	Additional Maths - Students practiced past year question on Trigonometry and completed their first formative assessment.



SCIENCE

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students learned about compounds and how to name those made of two and three elements.
Y8	Students explored the usage of distance-time graph.
Y9	Students investigated methods of finding the volume of irregular shaped object and learned about methods to take multiple readings.
	Combined Science - Students explored factors affecting enzymatic reaction and started learning about photosynthesis.
Y10	Physics - Students practiced more on vectors acting at right angle and learned how to calculate speed.
	Biology - Students continued to explore the 5 kindoms of classification.
	Chemistry - Students investigated the factors that affect gas pressure.



SCIENCE

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y11	Combined Science - Students learned about periodic trends in the periodic table.
	Physics - Students learned about voltage, current and resistance and how to calculate them.
	Biology - Students explored then presented the differences between gas exchange, breathing and respiration.
	Chemistry - Students investigated the titration method.

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y 7	Enterprise - Students completed their Formative Assessment and deepened their understanding of the topic by watching a video on The Role of Business Enterprise, followed by a set of reflective questions to reinforce their learning. Geography - Students developed an understanding of how to conduct a
	geographical enquiry.
Y8	History - Students learned about the Epic of Gilgamesh, one of the world's oldest stories, and discovered the many inventions of the Sumerians. They especially enjoyed a hands-on activity where they tried writing in cuneiform on clay, just as the Sumerians once did.
	Enterprise - Students completed their Formative Assessment and explored the concept of managing risk in enterprise, gaining insights into how businesses identify and respond to potential challenges.
	Geography - Students developed an understanding of what rivers are and how water flows into them.
	History - Students investigated why Queen Elizabeth I ordered the execution of her cousin, Mary, Queen of Scots, who was linked to treasonous plots. Students took part in an active debate session.
Y9	Enterprise - Students completed their Formative Assessment and developed their understanding of SMART Objectives, learning how to set clear, measurable, and achievable goals within a business context.
	Geography - Students developed an understanding of how volcanoes and earthquakes can be hazardous to people.
	History - Students studied poverty in Britain in 1901. They explored the harsh living conditions many people faced, examined key reports and events that revealed the scale of the problem, and learned about the Liberal Reforms that aimed to improve health, welfare, and education for the poor.

HUMANITIES	Schools Partnership
	Business Studies - Students completed their Formative Assessment and explored the different types of business organisations, gaining an understanding of how various structures operate and their impact on business decision-making.
	Accounting - Students completed their Formative Assessment and enhanced their understanding of the Accounting Equation, learning how assets, liabilities, and equity interrelate in financial decision-making.
Y10	Travel and Tourism - Students explored the different reasons why people travel — from leisure and relaxation to business, education, and cultural experiences. They discussed examples and reflected on how travel can meet a variety of human needs and interests.
	History - Students learned how the treaty's harsh terms led to widespread anger, financial hardship, and political instability, setting the stage for future challenges in the 1920s and 1930s.
	Global Perspectives - Students completed their Formative Assessment and practised answering Component 1 questions with increased confidence. They also engaged in meaningful discussions about their Team Project, sharing ideas and planning next steps collaboratively.
Y11	Business Studies - Students completed their Formative Assessment and gained a deeper understanding of the various sources of finance available to businesses, exploring how different funding options support enterprise growth and sustainability.
	Economics - Students completed their Formative Assessment and strengthened their understanding of Monetary Policy by answering exam-style questions, applying key concepts to real-world economic scenarios.
	Travel and Tourism - Students explored how current trends in tourism can affect brands. They answered an exam-style question and looked at some case studies about the factors affecting marketing.
	History - Students studied the Battles of the Somme and Verdun in World War I. They explored why these battles were fought, the heavy losses on both sides, and what they reveal about the nature of trench warfare.
	Global Perspectives - Students continued working on Components 2 and 3, developing their research and project work with teacher guidance. They focused on refining their ideas and strongthoning their skills in analysis and evaluation.

PARENTAL SUBJECT UPDATES MUSIC

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students focused on sight reading activities within soul-funk music and played in percussion groups.
Y8	Students focused on Blues music, counted the twelve-bar blues, practiced listening to chord progressions, and had an easy jam using Stevie Ray Vaughan's "Pride and Joy."
Y9	Students focused on solo improvisation using both the C major and major pentatonic scales.
Y10	N/A
YII	Students worked on their first composition draft, made changes based on initial feedback, emphasized musical form and articulation, and discussed plans for their second composition coursework.



Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Year 7 built on last week's expressive line work by exploring Albrecht Dürer's Armoured Rhinoceros. They practised hatching, cross-hatching and stippling to capture texture and tone, showing great focus and creativity.
Y8	Year 8 explored symbolism in portraiture, linking identity with their favourite characters. They practised drawing skills while experimenting with colour and composition to express ideas in imaginative ways.
Y 9	Inspired by Salvador Dalí and René Magritte, Year 9 created detailed eye drawings, then extended them with imaginative, surreal backgrounds. Each student produced something unique, combining observational skill with bold creativity.
Y10	Year 10 are deepening their personal projects through artist research. They analysed how their chosen artists use media and techniques and considered how to adapt these approaches to their own themes.
YII	Year 11 refined coursework with artist research and began mini-workshops in painting surfaces and mixed media. These sessions gave them the chance to experiment with new approaches, strengthening their prep boards and confidence.



Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Learners were introduced to the 'Voice, Expression and Emotion'. The topic emphasize- the implication of tone, pitch, and pace to express different emotions in dramatic scenarios.
Y8	Learners were introduced to the 'Conflict in Improvisation' to advocate critical thinking on creating believable conflict in improvised scenes, manipulate conflict to build dramatic interest.

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Intermediate - This week, Year 7 Intermediate Mandarin students learned how to say dates in Mandarin and discussed a comprehension text to strengthen their understanding.
	Advanced - This week, the students learned about the advantages and disadvantages of being DINK (Dual Income, No Kids) and single. They also read the article 《單身與丁克努力的意義》 and completed their tasks.
Y8	Intermediate - This week, students practiced describing relatives' personalities and hobbies, created dialogues about family activities, and wrote short paragraphs introducing their family members in greater detail.
	Advanced - This week, the students completed a listening practice as well as Formative Assessment 1 Listening.
Y9	Intermediate - This week, students practiced discussing relatives' occupations and personalities, created family interview dialogues, and wrote descriptive essays about their family members and their daily lives.

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y10	Foreign Language - This week, the students have mastered vocabulary related to self-introduction, parts of human body and they are also able to understand and respond to questions about self-introduction.

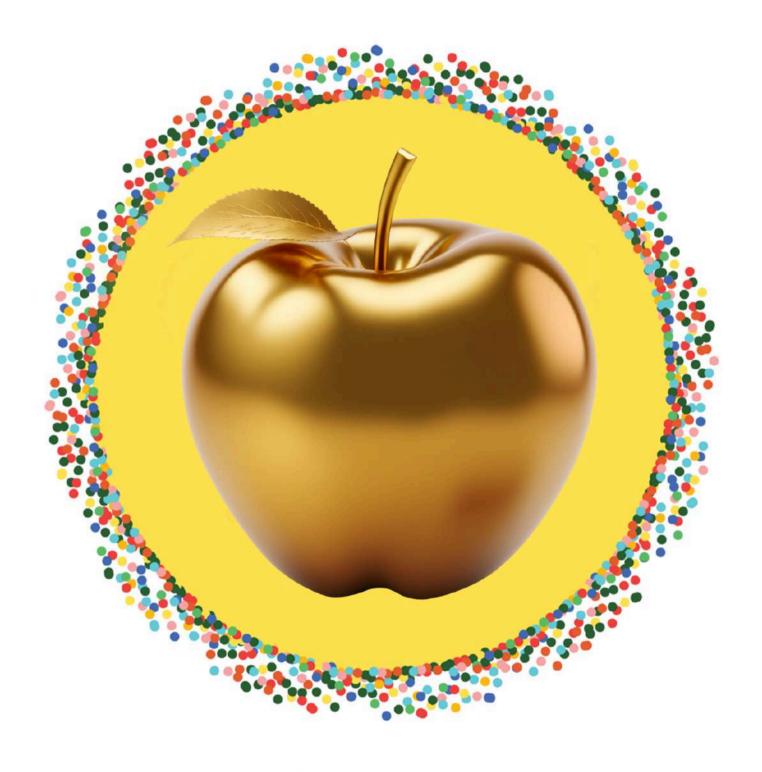
Progress
