Y9	English 1 - This week, students looked at bias in media, and wrote their own news reports using bias. They also read Chapter 8 of 'Animal Farm' and reflected on how the plot has developed in the novella so far.
	English 2 - Students chose a charater in Animal Farm and designed 'Whose phone is it?' to illustrate feelings.

Y10	Students practised on finding gradient and equation of parallel and perpendicular lines.
YII	Additional Maths - Students practised on modulus function and had an assessment on it.
Y10 Add Math	Students solved questions involving simplifying and solving algebraic fractions.
Y11 Add Math	Additional Maths - Students practised on expanding brackets using both Pascal's triangle and Binomial theorem.



#### **SCIENCE**

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Students explained how particles spread through a fluid and compared data on the solubility of different solutes to describe the point at which a solution becomes saturated.
Y8	Students investigated how pressure changes in liquid and its application in real life.
Y9	Students explored the different types of energy & learnt the usage of gravitatonal & kinetic energy formula.
Y10	Combined Science - Students learned the function of all seven classes of food and main organs in the alimentary canal.
	Physics - Students revised and practiced answering paper 4 questions on forces, energy and Hooke's Law.
	Biology - Students explored how to calculate magnification and make necessary measurements from the microscope image.
	Chemistry - Students presented how an atoms form ions and explained the reasons behind this occurence.



#### **SCIENCE**

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
	Combined Science - Students practiced answering paper 4 and paper 6 questions focusing on the periodic table and metals.
Y11	Physics - Students practiced answering paper 4 questions focusing on Unit 1 to Unit 5.
	Biology - Students described and outlined the main components in a nervous system.
	Chemistry - Students described how an insoluble salt is made.

#### HUMANITIES

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
	Enterprise - Students practised case study questions on stakeholder conflicts to deepen their understanding.
Y7	Geography - Students used a key on an OS map to identify various physical and human features and explored how map symbols help represent landforms and landscapes accurately.
Y8	History - Students began their journey into ancient philosophy by learning about Confucianism and gaining insight into the teachings of Master Kong (Confucius).
	Enterprise - Students learned about the stages of risk management and were introduced to SWOT analysis.
	Geography - Students described the characteristics and landforms found in the middle and lower courses of a river and explored how these features are formed through the processes of erosion and deposition.
	History - Students explored the Tudor system and examined the four social classes that shaped life in Tudor England.
Y9	Enterprise - Students learned about the importance of monitoring an action plan and completed some practice questions.
	Geography - Students explained why people choose to live near volcanoes and explored how communities can prepare for and respond safely to volcanic eruptions.
	History - Students investigated the causes of the First World War, analysing key factors that led to one of history's most significant global conflicts.

	Accounting - Students learned about the features, uses, and importance of various business documents and practised related questions to strengthen their understanding.
	Travel and Tourism - Students explored different types of destinations, their key characteristics, and related case studies to understand what makes destinations appealing and sustainable.
	History -Students delved into League of Nations case studies, strengthening their understanding of the organisation's successes and failures.
	Global Perspectives - Students learnt how to answer Question 3 from the past year Paper 1 (written paper).
Y11	Business Studies - Students learned about the Statement of Financial Position and practiced with past year questions.
	Economics - Students delivered a presentation and led a discussion on Multinational Corporations and Foreign Direct Investment . They also practiced past year questions.
	Travel and Tourism - This week, students learned about market segmentation and the product/service mix. The week culminated in formative assessment feedback and a case study on market segmentation.

Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y7	Our Year 7 artists have been busy preparing for the Enchanted Autumn exhibition with a focus on mysterious cats and other things that dwell in the twighlight! Students explored how to use line, shape, and proportion to bring their feline characters to life, adding magical details and expressive colour. Painting on black canvas helped their colours glow while creating a sense of atmosphere and mystery. The results are charming, imaginative, and full of character!
Y8	Year 8 students took their creativity into the night, exploring wolves, moonlight, and the beauty of darkness. Their pieces show strong understanding of perspective, tone, and composition, while experimenting with luminous colours against dark backgrounds to evoke mystery and mood. Some students also completed their Banksy-inspired street art earlier in the term, blending graffiti-style expression with meaningful social messages. The results are powerful, bold, and thought-provoking!

Students focused on perspective drawing, proportion, and atmospheric painting to transport viewers into their imaginative worlds. Year Group	What was covered this week in secondary lessons
Y10	Year 10 have been developing their Natural Forms projects, exploring different materials and techniques to capture the beauty of organic shapes. They have created micro and macro observational drawings of shells, fruit, and other natural objects, experimenting with watercolour, pencil, acrylic, and mixed media to refine their skills. The focus has been on observation, texture, and the transition between abstraction and realism. Their sketchbooks show excellent experimentation, confidence, and growing artistic independence—an important step in building their IGCSE portfolios.




## ISP ARTISTS






